It has certainly not escaped international attention that national-level policies to address climate change and clean energy development in the United States have been “missing in action.” One of President George W. Bush’s first major actions upon assuming the presidency was to reject the Kyoto Protocol on greenhouse gas emissions that had been negotiated by the administration of his predecessor, Bill Clinton. Apart from a few modest subsidy programs for hybrid cars, hydrogen energy research, and biofuels (especially corn-based ethanol) research and production, the U.S. federal government has not been very active in addressing these issues, and key executive and legislative branch positions are occupied by persons who remain stubbornly agnostic or openly skeptical of climate change, despite mounting scientific evidence of its existence
