**Development: Two Projects in Bangladesh**

**Abstract** 

Operations research often generates prescriptions for policy change that fail to influence what bureaucracies actually do. This article reviews the experience of two pilot projects in Bangladesh that have addressed the question of how such research can be designed to foster its utilization. In a rural field experiment in Matlab subdistrict, research has demonstrated that contraceptive services, if carefully designed and properly implemented, can influence demographic dynamics even where social and economic circumstances are not conducive to fertility change. Despite the success that Matlab represents, the project was not systematically utilized for policy until a second study was launched to address government questions concerning its replicability in the public sector programme. Results suggest that pilot projects, if fielded in conjuction with research systems for testing their replicability, can foster organizational development in contexts that are not conducive to bureaucratic change.
