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Ethnic Disparities in Degree Performance

Using unique administrative individual data, this paper examines ethnic differences in degree performance in Dutch college: universities. The paper estimates parametric duration models and accounts for unobserved heterogeneity to assess the so of ethnic disparities. The analysis shows that ethnic minorities from non-western countries have a significantly lower degree performance and higher risk of dropping-out. Especially, Turkish, Moroccan and Caribbean students are less likely to gradu and graduates among them need much more time to complete their study. There is no evidence that this disadvantage ste from poor parental socioeconomic position and the choice of study subject.
