The behaviour of migrant women on the labour market is influenced by a variety of factors, among which the culture of the h and host country. Part of the literature investigates the role of home-country culture. This study extends the literature by including a measure for the influence of host-country culture as an additional determinant of the participation of migrant wo The empirical model explains participation from demographics and educational attainment, and uses home- and host-coun female participation as proxies for culture. Evidence on the basis of the Dutch Labour Force Survey 1996-2007 suggests th both differences in home-country female participation and the trend in native female participation, as a measure for host-coculture, affect the participation of migrant women. The results suggest that host-country participation is at least as importa home-country participation.
