The results show that, overall, in Italy the number of people performing family care work is higher, also due to the larger population. Italians participate somewhat Standpunkte less than Poles in child care, but substantially more in care of the elderly because of demographic **Books** factors. However, the huge difference in the value of unpaid family care work, which in Italy exceeds the value of Poland by about eight times, is largely to be attributed to the discrepancy in hourly **Research Reports** earnings, average earnings of Poles being about one fifth of those of Italians. In GDP terms, instead, the value of unpaid family care work is more similar, ranging between 3.7 and 4.4 per cent of the **IZA Compact** Polish GDP and 4.1 and 5 per cent of the Italian GDP, depending on the estimation approach.
