Earnings and employment trends in the 1990s

Robust employment growth in high- and low-paying job categories was not accompanied by large wage gains; there was no apparent increase in overall earnings dispersion during the 1990s. The analysis presented herein extends the earlier work by examining the changes in both employment *and* earnings for all wage and salary workers over the 1989–99 period.
