Taylor Frequently Asked Questions **ABSTRACT** This investigation examined whether or not a functional analysis was useful in understanding the motives Recommend to Peers for secondary school students' motives for volunteering. Specifically, we coded comments from fifteen student interviews into the following five functions: value-expressive, social-adjustive, ego-defensive, Recommend to Library knowledge, and social-affirming. We calculated the percentages of students whose responses included each of the five functions and found that the students' responses were consistent with a functional Contact Us analysis. The implication of these findings for the creation of a Volunteer Functions Inventory for students is discussed.
