



The Three Sibilants in Standard Chinese

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This paper examines the place of articulation and articulatory variability for the production of the three sibilants in Standard Chinese. EPG data from 4 speakers and EMA data from 2 speakers show that [ʃ] is anterior to [ʒ] whereas it's meaningless to characterize a distinct place feature for [ʒ]. And the articulatory variability is mainly attributable to the inter-speaker sources.

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
