Age 12, 2007. **Do End in Sight: The American Occupation of Iraq.* a film directed by Charles Ferguous, visiting scholar at MIT's Center for International Studies, will be screened for the public in the auditorium of the Broad Institute of MIT and Harvard on Wednesday, May 2, at 6 p.m.

"No End in Sight" was a special jury prize at the 2007 Sendance Film Festival, held in Park City, Utah. The screening, to be followed by a discussion with the director, is sponsored by the MIT Center for International Studies' Sturr Forum.

"No End in Sight" analyses Iraq's descent into guestless was varied rule, criminally and anarchy.

Base on more than 200 loons of footage, the film restles the events following the fall of Baghdd in 2003 through interviews of such hightraining efficials as former Depart Secretary of State Richard Armingae, Ambassador Barbara Bodie, (who was in charge of Baghdad during the spring of 2003), Lavrence Wilkerson, former chief of stuff to Colin Powell, and General Jay Garner (who was in charge of the occupation of Iraq through May 2007) as well as Ferguon received his B.A. in multematics from Berkeley and his Ph.D. in political science from MIT. The author of three books, he has been a senior fellow at the Brookings Institution and a visiting echolar at MIT and Berkeley, and he is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations.
