In the atmospheric stillness before nightfall, a community of

eight young dancers explores a range of human

relationships through classical movement. Lyrical partnering

reveals a romantic array of emotions. Aspects of relationships and changing emotions are danced in a twilight world and so, remain mysterious and elusive. George Frideric Handel was born a German in Halle on February 23, 1685, and died an English subject in London on

April 14, 1759. He is considered to be one of the greatest

composers of the Baroque era in both vocal and

instrumental music and was a great virtuoso on the organ and harpsichord. According to legend, while in Italy (1707-1710) Handel had a duel on both harpsichord and organ with Domenico Scarlatti. According to Harold Schonberg, "As

harpsichordists both were declared equal. As organist, Handel won easily." It has been said that the 12 concerti grossi of Handel's Opus 6 rank with Bach's Brandenburg Concerti as "one of the twin peaks of the Baroque concerto."
