



Birmingham Royal Ballet Principals: Nao Sakuma (图)

Born in Fukuoka, Japan, Nao Sakuma trained at the Michiko Komori Ballet School and the Royal Ballet School, joining Birmingham Ro yal Ballet in 1995. She was promoted to Principal in 2002. Nao is a virtuoso classical dancer with a formidable technique and leads the Comp any in the classical repertory. She is particularly celebrated for her Aurora in The Sleeping Beauty and won great acclaim dancing that role du ring the Company's visit to the Richmond Festival in Virginia, USA. A sure comic touch can also be seen in performances such as Lise in L a Fille mal gardée and Swanilda in Coppélia, and she scored a particular success in the role of the Young Girl in Sir Frederick Ashton's The T wo Pigeons, which the Company danced at The Met in New York during the celebrations of that choreographer's centenary. With her freque nt partner Chi Cao she has represented the Company at several prestigious occasions, including the Ballet Boyz gala which re-opened the Roy al Festival Hall in London in 2006.
