Graphic design alumni brave the Chicago cold with a Guinness (or two!)

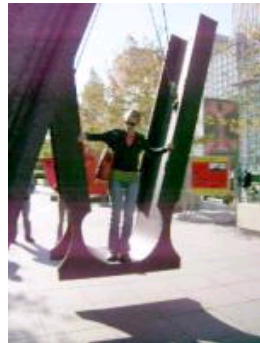


GD Alumni in Chicago

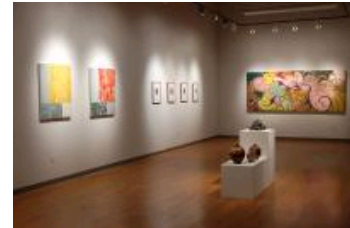
Visual communication and design graduate thesis

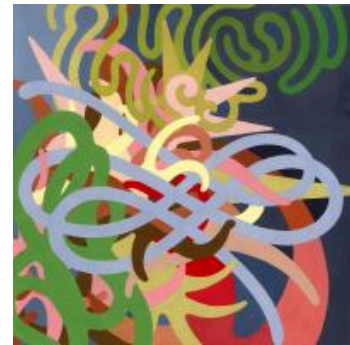

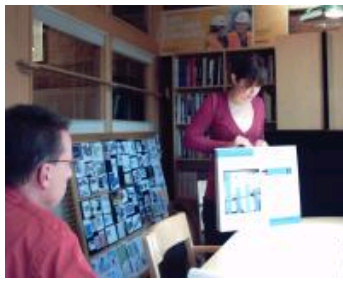
