This reform is concentrating on keeping and increasing the credibility and shifting to more competitive agriculture more in line with market needs. The main proposals include horizontal measures: Decoupling, Modulation/De-coupled Support, Cross-compliance, Farm Animal Welfare, IASC, Rural Development. Market issues concern dairy, durum wheat, dried fodder, seeds, nuts, rice, set-aside, beef.
