Two Michigan State University graduates are recipients of awards recognizing their achievements in the arts.

Molly Greeley, of Ann Arbor, and Jonathan Sage, of Eastpointe, both MSU College of Arts and Letters May graduates, are the university's recipients of the Louis Sudler Prize in the Arts for 2007.

The Sudler Prize is awarded annually to top college seniors from across the country who demonstrate outstanding achievement in the arts —

including the fine arts, music, creative writing, theater and the electronic/photographic arts. Students are nominated for the award by faculty members of their home institutions.

"When I was nominated, it meant a lot because it showed me that my professors believed in me," said Greeley, a senior English major with an emphasis on creative writing. "The award really makes me appreciate the knowledge and experience I've gained from the classes I've taken."

Although she was published in the 2000 and 2004 issues of the bimonthly teen Cicada magazine, Greeley made a conscious effort not to have her works published until she graduated. She considered her undergraduate studies an apprenticeship and a chance to hone her skills and talents.

Sage, a senior majoring in theater design, hopes the award will give him a jump-

start in the professional world. Since 2002, he has been involved in more than 50 theatrical productions, ranging from being the master electrician for "Oklahoma!" to working with sound design in "Romeo and Juliet."

"It was a bit of a surprise when I found out I was being given the award," Sage said. "I knew my name was put forth by my professors, but it was a pleasant surprise to be chosen out of an incredibly talented pool of artistic students."

Sage plans to continue his active involvement with theater and share his knowledge with students by working as a technical director at a smaller school or college.

The Louis Sudler Prize in the Arts has been honoring undergraduate students with artistic talent since 1982. Besides MSU, the award is given out at universities including Yale, Harvard, Princeton, Columbia, Johns Hopkins, Purdue, Duke, Rice, Stanford, Emory, Dartmouth College, Oberlin College

Sudler, a Chicago businessman and philanthropist who died in 1992, began his active support of music programs at MSU in 1970. That year he helped bring the Beethoven Bicentennial Festival with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra to East Lansing. He was also a founding member of the WKAR
