The University of Kansas will celebrate the legacy of Martin Luther King Jr. on Monday, Jan. 22, with a bicentennial walk on Jenkins Boulevard.

"This is a great opportunity for the KU community, former students and faculty to reflect on the achievements of Dr. King," said Shanti Nelson, program director of the Multicultural Resource Center.
