Late Lower Arch Crowding in Relation to Primary Crowding

ABSTRACT

A preliminary study of changes in crowding during the five years following eruption of all permanent teeth anterior to the third molar, showing a tendency toward increased crowding with some reciprocal interrelationships between anterior and posterior crowding.
