" We are showcasing new drug delivery mechanisms, diagnostic and screening devices, clinical practice tools, and assistive technologies for allied health and rehabilitation," said UniQuest managing director David Henderson.

More than 300 stakeholders in the Australian and international medical devices and diagnostics sector attend AusMedtech 2012. The two-day event (14-15 May) — run by by AusBiotech — is regarded as Australia's premier medical technology conference and includes an Investment Summit and Trade Exhibition.

Mr Henderson said UniQuest delegates were hosting a Trade Exhibition booth.

Global medical technology is one of the world's fastest growing markets, currently valued at US\$300 billion a year.
