EFSA and ECDC issue 2008 report on zoonoses and food-borne outbreaks in the European Union

EFSA and the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control

have published their Annual Report on Zoonoses and Foodborne outbreaks for 2008, which gives an overview of zoonotic infections shared in nature by humans and animals and disease outbreaks caused by consuming contaminated food. The report shows that the number of human cases of the three most reported zoonotic infections was lower in 2008 than in 2007.
