## MANAGING EDITOR'S REPORT

Only two years have passed since the initial meeting in June of 1997 at which representatives of the research community decided to form a peer-reviewed scientific journal concerning all disciplines of cotton science. Since sending out the initial Call for Papers, forty manuscripts have been published online in seven issues of the *Journal of Cotton Science*.

The initial Call for Papers (July of 1997) for the inaugural issue of the *Journal of Cotton Science* resulted in 50 manuscripts being submitted for consideration by the 13 technical editors. Of those 50 papers, nine were published in the first issue (December 1997) of *JCS*. Some of the 1997 manuscripts were subsequently published in 1998 issues. Total acceptance rate for 1997 submissions was 50% (Table 1).

In 1998, we received 38 manuscripts steadily over the year and posted four issues of the *Journal of Cotton Science* online. All disciplines added at least one alternate technical editor. Insect Research and Control was renamed Arthropod Management. Total acceptance rate for 1998 submissions was 34% (Table 2).

As of the end of August of 1999, we have published two issues in Volume 3 (1999) of the *Journal of Cotton Science* and have received 45 manuscripts for consideration. Sixteen of these

manuscripts have been through peer review (Table 3). The rate of acceptance for processed manuscripts is currently 50%. Manuscripts still in peer review (pending) account for 64% of those received to date.

Additional alternate technical editors were added to several disciplines and some of the original technical editors rotated off the Editorial Board. Disciplines that changed names and/or reorganized included Cotton and Other Organic Dusts (now Organic Dusts), Cotton Improvement (split into two disciplines – Molecular Biology and Breeding & Genetics), Disease (now Plant Path & Nematology), Soils & Plant Nutrition (now Soils), and Quality Measurements and Textile Processing (merged into Textile Technology).

The *Journal of Cotton Science* is at a turning point in its growth as a recognized peer-reviewed publication. The letter to the *Journal of Cotton Science* Community from Dr. Andrew G. Jordan, Executive Director of The Cotton Foundation, explains the formation of an Interim Editorial Board to further guide the development of policy for *JCS*.

I thank the entire team -- all of the technical editors, reviewers, authors and NCC staff -- who have made the birth of a brand new journal a reality. A special thanks goes to Stuart Pocknee of Agri-Publications who handles the final PDF and
