#### PRIZE ESSAY CONTEST

#### AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF ORTHODONTISTS

Eligibility: Any member of the American Association of Orthodontists; any person affiliated with a recognized institution in the field of dentistry as a teacher, researcher, undergraduate or graduate student shall be eligible to enter the competition.

Character of Essay: Each essay submitted must represent an original investigation and contain some new significant material of value to the art or science of orthodontia.

Prize: A cash prize of \$500.00 is offered for the essay judged to be the winner. The committee, however, reserves the right to omit the award if in its judgment, none of the entries is considered to be worthy. Honorable mention will be awarded to those authors taking second and third places. The first three papers will become the property of the American Society of Orthodontists and will be published. All other essays will be returned.

Specifications: All essays must be typewritten on  $8\frac{1}{2}$  x 11 white paper, double spaced with 1" margins and composed in good English. Three copies of each paper, complete with illustrations, bibliography, tables, charts, etc. must be submitted. The name and address of the author must not appear in the essay. For purposes of identification, the author's name together with a brief biographical sketch which sets forth his or her dental and/or orthodontic training, present activity and status (practitioner, teacher, student, research worker, etc.) should be typed on a separate sheet of paper and enclosed in a sealed envelope. The envelope should carry the title of the essay.

Presentation: The author of the winning essay will be invited to present it at the meeting of the American Association of Orthodontists to be held at New York City, New York, May 2-6, 1949.

Final Submission Date: No essay will be considered for this competition unless received in triplicate by the Chairman of the Research Committee on or before March 15, 1949.
