# Employment of Foreign Workers Quarterly LFS Migrant Worker Estimates August 2008

#### **Employment Rate by Country of Birth**

**Table 1** presents employment rates by country of birth and the change on the last year. 'South Africa' (86.3 per cent), 'Australia and New Zealand' (84.3 per cent) and 'EUA8' (84.3 per cent) continue to have the highest employment rates among the published country groups. 'Pakistan and Bangladesh' (46.1 per cent) has the lowest employment rate.

### Level of Employment by Country of Birth

**Table 2** presents the changes in the levels of employment by country of birth, and the change over the last year. Total employment has increased by 375,000, of which 240,000 is due to a rise in non-UK born employment. The country group with largest increase in migrant employment is 'EUA8' (62,000), followed by 'Africa Excluding South Africa' (60,000) and 'EU14' (19,000). Employment fell for only one country group over the period - 'Australia and New Zealand' (5,000). These figures should be interpreted using the sampling variability provided in the Integrated First Release and the approximate confidence intervals are presented in Table 2.
