

ACS Seeks Nominations for IT Journal Editor

Senior Research Professional needed to guide Australia's leading ICT Research Publication

The Australian Computer Society (ACS) seeks nominations from senior ICT professionals for the position of Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Research and Practice in Information Technology*. The position provides leadership for a team of international academics and researchers in the computer and telecommunications fields.

The *Journal of Research and Practice in Information Technology* is an international quality, peer reviewed journal covering innovative research and practice in Information Technology. It has been published since 1967 and is one of the world's oldest continuously published computer journals. The Journal contains articles that are of interest both to practicing information technology professionals and to university and industry researchers.

ACS's Chair of the Standing Working Party on Publications, Mr Worthington paid tribute to JRPIT's current Editor-in-Chief, Professor Sidney Morris (University of Ballarat) who has held the position for several years and will stay on until the new team can be constituted:

"Sid will be hard to replace, having maintained the rigorous academic standards of the Journal while making it attractive to IT practitioners, over an extended period in the position. What few realize when reading about advances in the internet and the web is that those developments depend on an infrastructure to provide credible research information," he said.

The Editorial positions are honorary and unpaid, but provide opportunities for academics, researchers and practitioners to influence their discipline. Membership is not limited to ACS members or Australian residents, since most work will be undertaken electronically, with minimal formal meetings. The ACS provides budget to the Editor-in-Chief for administrative assistance.
